Dan Moore Memorial Service at Ranfranz Funeral Home. May 12, 2023 10:30 AM



Dan was born March 21, 1926, in Bemidji, Minnesota, the son of Daniel Joseph Moore and Elsie (Wolfe) Moore. Dan enlisted in the Army Air Corps when he graduated from high school in 1944. He was a radio operator and gunner in WWII and

then stationed in Japan after the war ended. Dan married Nadene (Sunny) Booth on July 10, 1948, in Tenstrike, MN. He graduated from Bemidji State Teachers College in 1950. They moved their young family to Rochester and Dan began his career in the Rochester Public Schools that same year. While working as an English and social studies teacher at Central Junior High, Dan continued his education earning both a Master's degree and an Ed. Specialist degree in Counseling Psychology from the University of Minnesota. He was a guidance counselor at John Marshall High School for many years and was the first Director of Guidance at Mayo High School from 1967 until his retirement in 1986.

A Celebration of Dan's Life will be held Friday, May 12, 2023, at the Ranfranz and Vine Remembrance and Reception Center 5482 Royal Place NW, Rochester, MN. Visitation will begin at 10:00 am with a service at 11:00 am and lunch to follow. Inurnment will be at Oakwood East Cemetery, Rochester, MN.
