Circle of Service

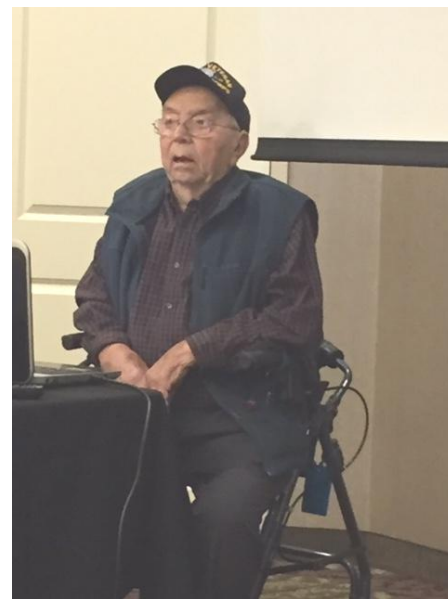

Herb was introduced by Dan Carlson. Herb was a pilot, a very young pilot, of a C-37 cargo plane. He related his experiences in the south Pacific. When asked what kind of armament they had on board, he answered an emphatic NONE. His type of aircraft was for transporting troops and supplies, mostly the latter. They were never intentionally sent into a combat area. Herb related one time that they discovered a Japanese Zero 'hiding' under their tail. He never did anything, so they figured that he was lost and using Herb's aircraft as a guide.

Herb's mind seemed remarkably sharp for a man of that age. His memory of incidents was amazing Thanks for your service, Herb
