Clare Warren made a presentation on the "Value of a Junior College". It was an autobiography of him. This had not been done since he joined Rochester Kiwanis in

1995. You can add that to the 35 years he had been a member of Kiwanis in Chelsea, MI and that's a long time. He related how he had started his college in Flint, MI Junior College. After completing 2 years there (with a tuition of \$75 a semester) he moved into the world of Big Ten schools at the University of Michigan. By then he had been recruited by the School of Dentistry and decided that was what he would pursue as a life career. 5 years at the U of M (That's Michigan) The education at J.C. was a great intro to educational life. It was very personal because of less students than the 55,000 at the big university. As is the case, often, you get into the groove of education and do better as time moves on. He spent a couple of years after graduation from Dental School in

the USAF in Madison, WI. Then it was back to MI and the Small town of Chelsea, near Ann Arbor. There he established a solo dental practice that lasted for 35 years. During those years he got married to June, and had a fine family of 1 boy and 3 girls.

He was active in Kiwanis, the Chelsea School Board for a brief 4 years, and lots of support for the Methodist church in town. It was a good life with a minimum of hiccups along the way.

By 1995 and the migration of some of the children to Rochester, MN, drew Clare and June to be more centrally located with the family. Clare had gotten his Dental Licensure for MN in case he wanted or needed to work after retiring at a relatively young age. He worked at RCTC for about 6 years in the Dental Assisting program part time. At the same time he got another part-time job at a local dental laboratory. This job he liked the arrangements and the people, stayed 18 years up to the Covid pandemic. I guess he is done now.

The point of going into this detail was to show that lack of funds is not a deterrent to achieving a good education. I still remember most of my teachers at J.C. with mostly fond memories. 2-3 of them were really outstanding teachers, including my German teacher. (No, she was not 25 and attractive)

Anyway, Junior College was a great and affordable start to a good education and career. I highly recommend consideration of the less glamorous surroundings. Don't ignore it. Garage Sale: Once again this was amazingly successful thanks to a few who did a great deal in organizing and running the sale. I have to point out two members, Austin Jorgenson and Roger Krsnak as two of the 'drivers.' I can't be very specific on what exactly each did, but I think the whole club is aware of it. Austin has been talking it up for over a year and Roger jumping in a little later inviting us to have it in his garage as in the past. Members were good about signing up to help this year. For some of us the mountains in Roger's neighborhood are a bit more challenging each year, but we got great help overall. Roger reports that it brought in about \$1700.

Then this was followed by Roger with his organizing the Pizza Ranch fund raising project. He says he had \$100 in tips from our work that Monday evening, with a percentage of the day's receipts to be received soon. The people knew that they were indirectly supporting education awards by Kiwanis.
